





The Brant-Farnham Historical Society - Promoting Local Military Veterans and Local History!

The Brant-Farnham Historical Society participated in the 3rd annual Farnham Fire Department Community Days. The two day event was held on September 1st and 2nd at the Steven J. Rauker Veterans Memorial Park on Commercial Street, Farnham, N.Y. This is the third year that the historical society has been in attendance to highlight and promote the history of Erie County's smallest village. The exhibit consisted of six display tables which included a variety of Farnham related information, stories, photographs, photo albums and memorabilia. Included as well were six banners depicting people, structures and scenes of our community.

The visitors this year were especially drawn to our military themed table and military banners. More than a few people mentioned how pleased they were that we were stressing the importance of and recognizing those who have served our country. Our most recent military banner includes over 45 photos of our local veterans; current and past, living and deceased. Alphonso Butlak, Farnham's blacksmith, craftsman and a Navy veteran, was delighted to find himself included in our banner as you can see in the one photo.

In our other photo, Josephine Battaglia, (Farnham's Oldest Citizen), is proudly showing Mike Graci, her grandson Anthony Battaglia's photo. The Battaglia family has served in two branches of the military for three generations. This includes Josephine's husband and his three brothers, her two sons and previously mentioned grandson. Josephine's brother-in-law Salvatore J. Battaglia, Pvt. 9th Div., 60th Infantry, served in WWII from January 1941 - March 26, 1943. Tragically, he was killed in action in North Africa. For this ultimate sacrifice, Salvatore earned and received posthumously, a Purple Heart Medal and certificate. Mike Graci is a veteran as was his father William. Sadly, Mike's uncle Michael A. Graci, was killed in action during WWII.

Josephine Battaglia 99 Years on July 6th 2021!!

Josephine (Spratz) Battaglia was born in Farnham on July 6, 1922. Baptized from St. Anthony's Church, Farnham she attended and graduated from the Farnham Public School and Angola High School. She married Russell A. Battaglia (from Farnham) and together they raised three terrific children, Ronald, Joyce and Russell.

Josephine worked in the kitchen at the Farnham School and we are told she was the best cook! [Mayor Hoisington, a Farnham School Alumni, personally confirmed this statement to be true!] She was a Village of Farnham Historian for a number of years.

Even today she keeps busy with daily church, weekly golfing, playing cards with the girls, building jig saw puzzles (lots of them!), and feeding all the birds in the neighborhood! You can't help but love Josephine Battaglia!!

June 15, 16 and 17 15th Annual Brant Summer Festival at the Brant Town Park. Farnham Fire Department won 1st place in the Water-

ball Contest.

June 19 Farnham Village Board Meeting

June 20 Brant Farnham Historical Society Meeting (3rd Wednesday of each month.)

June 25 The Brant-Farnham Historical Journal, Volume 52 is available. Distribution began at the Brant Summer Festival. Free until they run out.

June 25 Brant Summer Festival display. Our display was well received with the main focus on our Military. We had a new banner made for our Military Veterans and two other banners for "Horsepower" theme. One with working farm horses and the other for Motorcycle theme. This was the 15th Annual Brant Summer festival. We provided the "historical center pages" to the summer festival committee for the information booklet which was distributed for the festival, again the focus was on our military veterans. We counted 131 visitors logged into our visitor book for the Brant Summer Festival. We again invited the Gowanda and Buffalo Model Rail Road club to join us in our display area. They brought the ever popular Thomas the Train area as well as their N-gauge portable display. Evans Historical society provided 3 large information boards on the Angola Horror Train Tragedy as part of a mini display. Janet Bowman, Marci Muffoletto, Donna Borngraber, Tracy Kaczmarek, Lorraine Dunkel, Josephine Battaglia and Patty Friend were helpers with one or more of the following: preparing the area for display, setup, sitting at display, taking down the display and transportation of the display items.

July 2018 We had our News Journal ready for distribution at the Brant Summer Festival. Vol. XIX dated June 25, 2018 Vol. NO. 52. It has 52 pages and has been well received! We will have some for distribution at Farnham Community Days.

Discussion regarding Brant's Oldest Citizen. Patty received an email (July 6th) from Arlene Miller that her mom, Reva Mac-Dowell is THE oldest Brant citizen. She turned 98 on October 7, 2017. After verifying the information with a few people, Patty ordered a new "Oldest Brant Citizen" Ribbon and is making arrangements to have a photo taken. Patty received the ribbon on

August 3, 2018 and hand delivered the ribbon to Reva on August 8, 2018. (Reva is currently at a Nursing facility in Eden.) A photo could not be taken at that time, however Reva's daughter Arlene did email a new photo of Reva holding the ribbon. We will put an article in the pennysaver with a correction. Next year we will advertise for the oldest citizen to be sure we don't leave anyone out in error again! Keep in mind that Josephine Battaglia is the oldest Farnham resident. Josephine doesn't mind getting bumped out of first place for the Brant title!

At our July meeting we also discussed the trolley route as a bike path and the Farnham boundaries. Ray Dunkel was looking for more information on Dan Kibler. Dan is one of the veterans on our veteran listing, who died during the War.

Our historical society was invited to join the Evans Historical Society with their historical display at the Erie County Fair. The Fair and historical building theme is "What your community did to help with the war effort". At our July meeting, we came up with the following ideas during our discussion: Ration books for food/gas/oil. Victory gardens, knitting individual squares to make a blanket for hospital. School kids bought stamps to put in a book and when filled can get a bond. War bonds, scrap drives (cans/aluminum foil/ newspaper), couldn't get tires or buy cars, make butter on farm to sell to city people and eggs too. Also sold pickles for \$0.01 cent each. Civilians spotting aircraft (Civil defense). (We know that Jere Hoisington's grandmother did this). Air raid warden; (Ray Dunkel was one.). [August information: The combined fair exhibit actually contained many of these items. In the end, the Evans Historical Society provided most of the display items and we provided some canning factory photos, copies of Josephine Battaglia's war ration coupons, some of our farm implements and canning jars. Set up was on 8/05/2018 and Patty joined six others from the Evans Society. We found out on day one of the Fair, that the display won "BEST IN SHOW"!] Patty attended the awards dinner held at the fairgrounds on September 12, 2018 joining four others from the Evans Society.

September 1st and 2nd Farnham Community Days. We had a display at the celebration with over 75 People signing our book. (More visited but not everyone signed the book.) We gave away 27 books that were purchased at the Angola library book sale. All the books had something to do with history. (Young and old alike were excited to choose a free book!) We also had a raffle for the "Buffalo News Veterans of WNY" book. This was won by David Pruett. The \$40 book was donated by Bill and Patty Friend. The Tent and tables were "rented for free" to the historical society as donation by Chad and Tracy Kaczmarek and family.

November 2018


Jennifer Leone and her father-in-law Joseph F. Leone paid a visit to our October meeting. Joseph was a resident of Brant for much of his early years. He is 84 now. (Born January 2, 1934) It was a terrific visit and both were happy to be there and share stories with us. We found a photo of Joe in our 1964 Quarto-Sesquicentennial book of Brant as he had been on the executive committee for the anniversary celebration and the dinner and tickets committee. He also remembered driving a Ford convertible in one of the Strawberry Festival parades. He attended Brant 1 and Brant 2 schools as well as Farnham #5 (old) wooden and "new' modern school. He brought his mom and dad's wedding invitation (from 1924), and I believe the reception was held in the "Brant Garage". Joe's family once lived in "the old Hooper house", in the Pero apartment house at the Brant four corners and also in Farnham on Railroad Avenue next to Militello's store. His mom was Della Christopher and his dad Pasquale Leone. He said that his grandfather laid the brick road in Farnham. Siblings: Anthony, Lena, Irene and Antoinette. Joe was youngest. 


December 2018

#### January 2019

Update on the pictorial postmark project in December 2018. Involved three post offices: Farnham on Dec. 18, 2018, Brant on Dec. 20, 2018 and Angola on Dec. 27, 2018. Farnham first day totals (4 hrs.) 223 "Christmas Card Station" cancels. Brant first day totals (4 hrs.) 225 "Christmas Card Station" cancels. Angola first day totals (8 hrs.) 125 "Glad Tidings to You" cancels. Thank you to David Tempestoso - Postmaster of all three post offices, for allowing us to have this project as well as PSE Karen (Gugino) Herc and Carrie McDonough. Patty spent about 3 hours at each of the Post offices on each of the "pictorial postmark" dates. A table with holiday goodies, provided by the historical society was shared with those who came to the post offices. The first person to request the cancel at Farnham and Brant was Bob Kuhn. Becky Leone visited all 3 of the post offices. She resides in Angola and both she and her dad are collectors. Brant PO has a special book to sign for those who visited

the PO and received the cancel. Requests for the cancels are also mailed in and will continue to be mailed in until 30 days from the cancel first dates. Requests were received from as far as Oregon, California and Florida for the Farnham Cancel. Brant and Angola information will be available at a later date.

At our meeting that was supposed to be cancelled...but we ended up having one - Josephine Battaglia brought a certificate from President FDR in regards to Salvatore Battaglia (her brother in law, a Farnham native who was KIA during the WWII). She also brought in her high school autograph books from 1938 and 1939 -these were very cute!! Ray Dunkel is working on a project to find out where some of our veterans are buried - especially: Ray Koch, Herman Timmerman and David Briggs (we believe David is buried in N. Collins). Ray would like his records to be updated. This is his own personal project, but he will definitely share his findings with the historical society.

#### February 2019

Final Report: Pictorial cancel project in December 2018. Involved three post offices: Final Totals (on 30th day): Farnham: 317, Brant: 329, and Angola: 218. Farnham and Angola received 52 mailed in requests. Brant received 32 mailed in requests. International requests were received from Singapore and Canada. Brant PO recorded 44 names in their special cancel guest book for this cancel on December 20th.

**February 2019** Brant Town Board resolution to appoint Ashley Kurcuz as part time patrol officer. Speed limit resolution will need to go to County and DOT per town attorney Bill Trask. Changing the speed limit to 45 mph on Versailles Plank, Mile block Road, Hammond, Hardpan and Lotus Point Roads. New Business included Proposed Local Law #1 2019. We currently have 2,000 residents in the town of Brant. Town Board consists of: Council Members Mike Muffoletto, Don Clark, Donna Marien, Janice Ross and Supervisor Mark DeCarlo.

#### April 2019

Ray Dunkel reported that Veteran William Hoth is buried in Brant Cemetery. Ray is and has been trying to locate the final resting places of a few of our veterans. Ray is also putting out a request for help on the weekend prior to Memorial Day for volunteers to place flags on the graves of our veterans in our local cemeteries

**April 2019** Farnham is moving ahead with replacing the street lights with LED lights. Farnham Fire Department said that about 60 kids attended the Easter Egg Hunt. Board Members: Trustees Vincent Rovnak, Yvonne Heller, Elizabeth Huffnagle, George Cordia, Mayor Jere Hoisington. The village Clerk-Treasurer is Jackie Hoisington.

#### May 2019

Discussion regarding the upcoming Brant Summer Festival. Discussed ideas of what to focus on for the display. It was suggested by the Festival committee to concentrate on the businesses of Brant and Farnham. The historical members think

that is a good plan. We will place an advertisement in the Pennysavers asking for old photos to scan. Discussion followed regarding the Old Anderson Greenhouses in Farnham. Ray Dunkel, Jo and Russell Battaglia, Reva MacDowell, Atha Trask and Elsie Sager worked there. Ray and Jo said that Mr. Marchant (who lived next door to the green houses) was the manager. We have an copy of the aerial photo of the greenhouse that George Stephenson had loaned us for our 175th Anniversary Book of Brant. He currently lives in the home that Mr. Marchant had lived in. We hope to create another Veteran Banner as well.

Water Tower in Farnham - Last month the question was asked by Jim Russell: "Does anyone remember the water tower freezing?" Ray Dunkel responded that water towers should not freeze because the water from the ground is warmer and it circulates through the tower.

May 2019 Brant Town Board Meeting. Brant Supervisor budget modification includes adding a police vehicle to capital budget. \$30K. A public hearing is scheduled for June 6th to discuss Local Law #2. Police Chief Don Hepkins reported that he has two grants in process. (He does his own.) The police are participating in Operation Safe Stop at Lake Shore and North Collins Schools. Bailiffs are needed for police help because with the new plate reader. The new plate reader helps the police catch more people with outstanding warrants. It was noted that NYS DOT has our request for speed limit changes.

# 175th Anniversary of the Brant Post Office is on May 25, 1844 - May 25, 2019

May 25 We were reminded during early May that the Brant PO would celebrate 175 years on May 25, 2019. (Someone in Eugene, OR, wrote a letter to the PO asking for the date stamp on that date.) Luckily Carrie McDonough shared this with us and we were able to create two special anniversary envelopes. One design was hand drawn by a Brant 1 who was a 4th grader in 1995 - Paul Orlando. The other was a photo of the PO taken in 1982 by Carlton Winters. The day was a success. The PO was only open 2 short hours. Over 22 people signed the book in the Post Office.

May 2019 Memorial Day celebrations at Brant and Farnham June 7 Farnham to have special meeting to discuss local law #1 at 7PM.

June 2019 Discussion regarding the upcoming Brant Summer Festival. It was suggested by the festival committee to concentrate on the businesses of Brant and Farnham. An adv. was placed in the pennysavers asking for old photos to borrow or scan. (Ran adv. for 2 weeks/2 pennysavers.) No responses received. Larry Lowell did volunteer to go around and take photos of businesses if needed. We are going to create a book for Brant Summer Festival too. We will only stick to the theme of Businesses. We will not include the years activities as we have for the past yearly journals. This will be a "special edition" focusing only on this topic.

June 14, 15 and 16 2019 The Brant Summer Festival display

theme was "Minding our Business". (Idea was suggested by the Brant Summer Festival Committee.) Our display focused only on businesses of Brant and Farnham through the years. Six tables packed with various memorabilia, photos and such. We had the DVD of the Joe F. Catalano and Sons Farm for all to enjoy as well. Two of the banners were made up of photos of various truck door advertisements of Brant and Farnham Businesses and a third banner consisted of 1959 business listings from DeWitt's phone directory. We had visited local businesses to photograph their vehicle door advertisements where/when time permitted. We collected photos after the banners were prepared as well (on-going project).

Our news journal for Brant Summer Festival (Vol. XX dated June 25, 2019 WHOLE NO. 53) was titled "Minding our Business." It was 72 pages. Quantity of 200 were published and distributed free, but donations towards them were and still are accepted. (Books cost about \$5.50 ea. to print.)

March 29 Pennysaver lists Town of Brant office schedule. The offices are open by appointment only. Schools are closed with virtual learning via the internet connections.





### April 2019

Email inquiry from Jay Kempton - requesting information regarding his ancestor George Washington Kempton, who was married to Maria Grannis. Georgianne Bowman has been helping us with this request. Patty did send Jay some information on the Grannis family which Georgianne had compiled in 2013 for the historical society. Jay emailed a copy of the 1925 marriage license of Fred Kempton (born in Brant, NY) to Cora Strang in Portville, N.Y. (Fred's parents were George Kempton and Maria Grannis.)

#### May 2019

Email inquiry from Fred Parker - looking for information on his ancestors who one lived in Brant, N.Y. and were early settlers in Erie County. Patty has sent Fred some information and will be sending more soon. Ancestors are: John K. Parker, born in PA in 1820, buried in Brant in 1899 and John's wife Mary who was born in 1822 and died in 1866. We found record of John K. Parker living in Lot 22 consisting of 83 acres in the 1878 assessment rolls (Cain and Morley Roads. The property was valued at \$2400.00 and his tax was \$12.90). The 1880 map shows the 83 acres in Lot 32, but the assessment records have it listed as Lot 22.

#### November 2019

Email inquiry from Chris S. in Germany, wondering if we have any information on his Hoffman (Hovman) relative who, as the family story is told, was run over by Oxen in the Town of Brant in 1840. We are hoping that Georgianne Bowman can help us with this. His wife's maiden name was "Kern". We did find mention of this Oxen tragedy in the 2002 North Collins History book. The page was scanned and emailed to Chris S early March. He is still looking for the marriage certificate of Frederick Hoffman and Catherine Kern.

### January 2020

Email inquiry from Michael Duggan, wondering if we have a 1970 photo of his wife as Strawberry Festival Queen. Her name was Kathy Culligan, now Kathy Duggan. We have not yet found one. We contacted him to see who her sponsor was. It was Bob Beck, so Patty called Bob. Bob had thrown away the old photos about 4 years ago. He will try to contact some of the other people who may have photos and then get back to us. Bob said the sponsor was actually the Shoreliners who were a Drum Corp out of Lakeview Fire Hall.

any daughters Ansel Smith had. His 4th greatgrandfather married a woman with the maiden name Smith and named one of his sons, Ansel. Wondering if it is a coincidence or a relation. Email inquiry from James T. Bucki, regarding the exact 20 acre grove and air strip once located near Southwestern Blvd and Hardpan Roads. Email inquiry regarding "Hurricane Hall" somewhere near Milestrip Road and bordering the Cattaraugus Reservation. (Contacted the Assessors of Brant to see if they have any records pertaining to this.) May have been located in Lot 26 or Lot 19. Email received 10/12/20 confirming that Lot 26 was where "Hurricane Hall" was located. Closest to western border of Lot 26. Brant's "Haunted" house was located here. We had shared entries of Frank and Carol Zeffiro's search and survey (which they had donated a copy to us in December 2020) with Patti in December 2020. We had contacted the Zeffiro's as well as Sue and Carl Falk to see if they recalled a home on the reservation end of their properties. A day ago, we came across a small notation of the Hickey Farm being sold in an Angola Record Newspaper (5/28/1928). Shared this piece of infor-

She listed her ancestors: "Smiths held the first Brant meeting in their home where officers were elected in forming the town. # Memorial Day





## The inscription on the base of the Civil War Cannon monument which resides in the Brant Cemetery

The Civil War cannon, a gift from the Federal Government, had been transported by a horse drawn wagon from Angola, N.Y. to the Brant Cemetery in 1897.

On May 10, 1899, several G.A.R. (Grand Army of the Republic) veterans, led by Elbridge G. Fenton and Morgan L. Clark (both of Brant, N.Y.), met at the Brant Cemetery to build a base for the civil war cannon. The cost to build the base was recorded at \$45. Ten days later the cannon was mounted on the base. Then on May 30, 1899 - **Memorial Day** - the James Ayer Post No. 202 hosted dedication services at the site. The inscription on the cannon base reads as follows: "Erected in memory of soldiers and sailors of the war of 1861-5."

Both Elbridge and Morgan fought in the Civil War, with each first enlisting in May of 1861. Elbridge Fenton was a Sergeant in Company B of the 21st New York Infantry and for his second enlistment a Private of the 9th Battalion of the 33rd Light Artillery Battery.

Morgan L. Clark was a Private with Company D of the 8th Illinois Calvary. He later enlisted as a Private, Company C of the 67th Regiment, New York Infantry (National Guard).


## The Results of the Brant-Farnham 181st Anniversary Contest HELD IN MARCH 2020


