



Jacob Beuzenburg, One of Brant's Earliest Farmers

Mr. Jacob Beuzenburg was regarded as a pioneer in the field of garden farming. He moved to Brant in 1880 after his marriage to Sarah (Miller) in June of that same year. His was known as "The Brant Center Fruit Farm". In our 1964 Town of Brant Quarto-Sesquicentennial History publication written by Carlton Winters, we find mention of other early farmers of Brant. "*The first farmer to locate on the Milestrip Road was Levi Evans and his wife, Marilla, grandparents of Tennyson Mackey. Other early farmers were the Goldsmiths, William Krull, Sr., H.B. Christy, Ralph Evans in that area. Nearer Brant Center was Henry Curtis, Peter Reifel, Abraham Dimon, John Wetherbee, Jake Beuzenburg, John C. Winters, D.H. Odell and Oliver Ellsworth."*

A few years back, town of Brant residents MaryEllen and Larry Beuzenburg shared with us a 1930 newspaper clipping regarding the 50th wedding anniversary of Larry's grandparents; Jacob and Sarah Beuzenburg. The couple were wed on June 17th in the year of 1880. We do not have the name of the news source, however, this almost 90 year old article provides us with the following information: "BRANT, N.Y., June 28 [1930] - Celebration of the 50th wedding anniversary of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Beuzenburg took place at their home at Brant, New York, on Tuesday." "... the anniversary ceremony was solemnized by their son, Clarence Beuzenburg, who is justice of the peace, officiating."

The article continues with: "Mr. Beuzenburg was born in Holland in 1857, coming to this country when 16 years of age and settling at Dunkirk. Mrs. Beuzenburg (nee Sarah Miller), who is three years younger than her husband, was born at Sheridan where she resided until her marriage. For 50 years the couple have lived in the same town, where Mr. Beuzenburg is regarded as a pioneer in the field of garden farming. He tells of the day when wages of five dollars a month were given. He is one of the directors of the Evans National Bank at Angola and takes an active interest in its affairs. He retired some years ago and lives at the homestead at Brant. Mr. and Mrs. Beuzenburg have four children living and three dead and have four grandchildren."

#### The Pingitore Farm on Erie Road, Brant, N.Y.

The Pingitore family purchased property on Erie Road in the town of Brant in 1915. Prior to this, the property was known as the Isaac Belote Stage Coach Inn and was also referred to as Bonnybrook Farm.

In 2014, Sandra (Pingitore) Hooge wrote her family history for the historical society's published anniversary book. The following selection of that history, describes the family and some of their farming adventures. "They began farming and farming they did. As on other farms in Brant, the Pingitores grew berries and grapes as well as moving into dairy with Holsteins for milk production. They added greenhouses which were built by Gus and Tony Pingitore. Eventually these greenhouse's provided thousands of seedlings for the area growers as well as gardeners.

The Pingitore brothers Gus and Tony saw the potential for retail sales as they were located on Erie road. They began to sell produce from a table in front of the house. That table over the years developed in to a fairly large stand where no fewer than four were required to work on the weekends! The Pingitore stand became a destination for those seeking fresh, high quality vegetables and fruit. People came from areas both near and far. The "iconic poplars" that stood above the stand offered shade to all who came and as a welcome relief on hot summer days.

Today in 2022, the property has long since been sold, the greenhouses, the stand and the home are gone. However, we do have a wonderful written history of the lovely farm that once was and many residents to this day, can still recall. The property is just North of the Evangola State Park entrance. Why not take a drive soon to take notice if the "iconic poplars" remain.

The Farmer - Our Everyday Hero

From the Centennial Book of the **Town of Brant** 1939: "Agriculture is still the main industry of Brant, but it has become more intensified. Huge crops of beans, strawberries. tomatoes and raspberries are produced here. Individual farmers think nothing of raising from one hundred and fifty to two hundred acres of beans, tomatoes, or raspberries. Individual farmers who might be mentioned here of raising those amounts of acreage are George Leone, John C. Winters, Catalano Bros., Joseph Conti, Walden Krull. They ship to canning factories in Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and some New England States and in large cities of our own State. Although today canning in the Town of Brant is on a small scale, the production of these vegetables is an immense

You know how much we enjoy sharing our Brant Strawberry Festival photos! The photo of Rose Dispence captures a display of First Place Blue Ribbons on the four strawberry crates labeled as: Red Coats, blank, Sure Crop and Earlidawn. Don't you just love the glimpse of the festival hustle and bustle in the photo background as well? We don't know if it was Rose or her husband Russell Dispence that had officially won the ribbons. Russell and Rose Dispence and family were involved in the Brant Strawberry Festival activities throughout the years, serving on a multitude of festival committees. Their farm and business (Brant Implement Service) was located on the Milestrip Road in Brant with descendants residing at the homestead and surrounding land area today. It was Rose and Russell's grandchildren who donated this photo to the historical society and many strawberry festival related items including pins, ribbons, trophies and miscellaneous paper items such as additional photos, strawberry shortcake tickets, postcards, festival parking permits and associated correspondence. We greatly appreciate the family sharing these items with us as they are on permanent display for those who visit our historical room.

From a 1964 Strawberry Festival booklet we found the following tidbits of information regarding the local strawberry crops...

"Here in New York State, Erie County ranks as the largest Strawberry - producing area in the state and in the little Town of Brant, home of the home of the Strawberry Festival, we find the heart of this Strawberry-producing area. During the past five years, the Strawberry acreage in the Brant- North Collins area has remained quite constant. About 1200 acres of this red luscious fruit are planted annually, in comparison with the 1600 acres of six years ago. A shortage in the labor supply, which is so vital to the harvest of this crop, has necessitated a decrease in acreage. Types of Strawberries typically grown in the Brant-North Collins region are: Red Glow, Sure Crop, Earlidawn, Dixieland, Pocahontas, Sparkle, Midway and Jerseybelle. Many consumers sometime question why there are so many varieties grown here. The answer is simple. Every grower has a different type of soil on his farm and he may find one variety more adapted to his soil than another. Then, too, many growers prefer to plant four or five kinds in order to lengthen the harvesting season. By planting an early variety (Earlidawn), a midseason variety (Midway) and a late variety (Sparkle) and a very late variety (Jerseybelle), a grower can assure himself that he will harvest strawberries over a four-week period. This also reduces the problem of needing a large labor force at any specified time."

# DON-CLIFF GREENHOUSES, Cain Road, Brant, NY

In the 1959 DEWITTS TOWN DIRECTORY OF BRANT AND NORTH COLLINS we found the following entry: "Don-Cliff Greenhouses, (Donald and Mrs. Donald Mayers) ns of Cain Road, lw of Versailles Plank Rd. NC RD2 NC3377". A few years back, Diane (Mayers) Hauck shared some photos with us of a greenhouse business once owned by her

family. It was located on Cain Road in the town of Brant, N.Y., close to the section of Cain Road which borders four separate towns: Evans, Eden, Brant and North Collins.

Diane's father Donald A. Mayers, owned the greenhouses on Cain Road with her grandfather who was Clifford Mayers - thus the name "Don-Cliff Greenhouses". Diane's grandfather is shown in one photo and another photo includes Diane's sister, Carol (Mayers-Ognan). The family moved from the farm and greenhouses in 1962 or 1963.



Pfc. Howard Nordblum and his wife (nee Dorothy Walker) of Farnham who was killed in action at Luzon on January 19, 1945. Pvt. Nordblum had been in the service since Jan. 9, 1941. He was married to Miss Walker, who is daughter of the Post Mistress of Farnham. on June 21, 1943.

#### FARNHAM RECORD

The death of Pfc. Nordblum brings the total number of Farnham boys who died in service to seven, which is something of a record for a community of 400 people.

These are listed as Lieut. Ray-These are listed as Lieut. Ray-mond Koch. airforce; Radio Oper-ator Ed. Steuhring, merchant ma-rine; Pvt. Sam. Battaglia in the infantry; Pfc. Ed. Schraeder who was killed in France, mechanized cavalry; Pfc. Horward Nordblum; Corp. Michael Graci who was killed Oct. 25, 1944 in Leyte; and Pfc. Daniel Kibler who died while in carvice in service.

Camp Porter, Farnham NY Documented by our town of Brant and village of Farnham history books and photographs, Brant was directly involved in World War I when a National Guard training camp was established on the shore of Lake Erie, principally on the property belonging to J. Kelderhouse. According to the *1909 New Century Atlas of Erie County*, the J. Kelderhouse land was located in lots 89 & 87 and consisted of approximately 112 acres, bordered on the West by Lake Erie and the North by the Town of Evans. The National Guard regiments arrived via special train on the Lake Shore and Michigan Southern Railroad. (L.S. & M.S.R.R.) Uniformed National Guard troops and the Headquarter's Band were discharged from the L.S. & M.S.R.R train station on Railroad Avenue in the village of Farnham and marched in full uniform to "Camp Josiah Porter", which was named so in respectful memory of Major-General Josiah Porter. As per the Annual Report of Brigadier-General Lauren W. Pettibone, Commanding Fourth Brigade of N.G.N.Y., the 65th Regiment performed field service from July 31st to August 7th, 1909 and the 74th Regiment performed field service from August 7th to August 14th, 1909, near Farnham, Erie County, N.Y. The report also states: "the respective commanding officers, 65th and 74th Regiments, will each detail a wagon guard consisting of one quartermaster, one lieutenant, one regimental or post quartermaster sergeant, one sergeant, three corporals, one musician, one hospital corps man, two cooks and twenty-four privates to troops to Kelderhouse's farm, three miles distant on the lake shore, where they will report to the Adjutant-General, 4th Brigade, and camp site will be assigned. The entire camp was laid out into company streets by Major George J. Metzger, Corps of Engineers." Each day of camp began with reveille at 6:00AM, followed by a full day of drills, assemblies, school, formations, mess calls and to mark the day's end, the playing of Taps at 11:00PM. The musician was busy as he had to "call to assemb

Today, the Evangola State Park is situated in part on the J. Kelderhouse's property, with over 80% of the Evangola State Park located within the town of Brant boundaries. Sometime after 1909, the Kelderhouse property was owned by Mr. William Shaw, who sold it to the Messina Lumber Co. The land was also used as a park called "Moonlight Bay". This same property was also owned by the Doyle sisters, prior to NYS taking ownership.



Uniformed National Guard troops and the Headquarter's Band were discharged from the L.S. & M.S.R.R train station on Railroad Avenue in the village of Farnham and marched in full uniform to "Camp Josiah Porter".

July 6th HAPPY 99TH BIRTHDAY TO JOSEPHINE BATTAGLIA ! October 3rd The Brant-Farnham Historical Society participated in the first Annual 'FALL ARTISIANS FESTIVAL". It was hosted by Veronica's Village Bistro in Angola, NY.. It was organized by Brant resident and local artisan Pamela Perrello. A rainy day, but yet plenty of visitors attended the event - including more than a few from our town of Brant (Sandy & Vince Fininzio, Josephine Friend, Bill Friend and Larry and Anita Lowell.) Historical Society member Joyce Cureo was scheduled to help, but sadly she fell and broke her ankle the day before. When we were deciding what to put on display, Joyce had the great idea to include memorabilia of Phyllis Notaro; Brant's Bowling Hall of Famer! Many are aware that Veronica's Village Bistro was once "The Old Ford Lanes" bowling alleys. The Notaro family had been owner's of the lanes at one time and also life-long town of Brant residents. Quite a few people commented how they remembered Phyllis, so it proved to be an excellent selection for display. We also included Lake Shore High School, Intermediate and Middle School year books, Strawberry Festival photos and program books and our new military poster. In addition we had on display information on President Lincoln's funeral train and it's travel through Angola and Farnham via the railroad. We chose various photos and documents from our archives related to Evans and Angola, such as early 1900's photos taken by Brant photographer Lynn Walters, old letters/envelopes from early Evans and Angola Business's correspondence that once belonged to Brant resident Herman Ciminesi), a wonderful book about the B&E Trolley by James E. Greene (the trolley lines ran through Angola and Farnham), locally published history books of Brant, Farnham, Evans and Angola, previously mentioned Lake Shore Central year books and a 1947 High School photo of the class trip to Washington, D.C. Mr. Bill Houston was one of the students in the photo! Bill had been Superintendent of the LSC Schools for many, many years and also Mayor of the village of Angola. We had various historical society newsletters available at no charge, and plenty more. As always, we were happy for the opportunity to promote our local history. It was a pleasure to chat with all those who stopped by! While at the Display held on October 3rd in Angola, our Historical Society donated one of our duplicate photos to the Evans Historical Society. It is one of the photos taken by Lynn Walters (of Brant, N.Y.) in early 1900. The photos were printed from glass plate negatives. 


